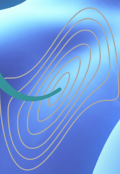

BY CAR

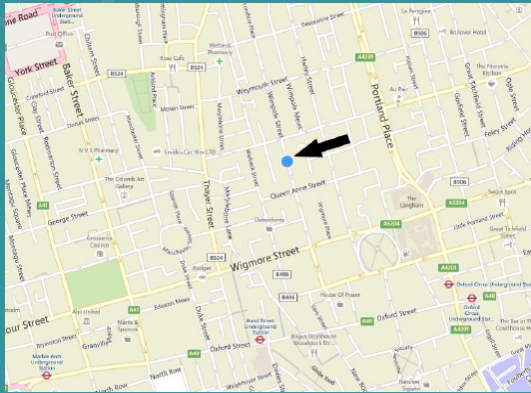
The venue is in the congestion charging zone. Wimpole Street is a one-way street, approached from Henrietta Place.
