BY TRAIN

Glasgow has two railway stations: Central Station and Queen Street Station. Central Station is situated on Gordon Street —and is approximately 3 minutes by taxi to 200 SVS. Queen Street Station is located next to George Square and is also 3 minutes by taxi. Both stations are within walking distance to the yenue.

BY BUS

Buchanan Bus Station is located on Killermont Street, just over half a mile from 200 SVS. Travel time is approximately 3 minutes by taxi or a 10 minute walk

PARKING

The nearest Car Park is 'Q-Park' on Waterloo Street. On street car parking is available on St Vincent Street and West Campbell Street which surround the building. This is a 'Pay and Display' service.

TRAVELLING BY AIR

Direct to Glasgow International Airport, then 15-20 minutes by taxi or here is the Express Coach which will bring you into the City Centre.

HOTEL INFORMATION

Apex City of Glasgow is a 4* hotel located within a 5 minute walk from 200 St Vincent Street.

DISABLED ACCESS

There are two disabled car parking spaces in the underground car park of the building. Access is gained via the entrance at the back of our 200 SVS which is located in West George Lane. Car parking must be arranged in advance or that 200 SVS can condition this.
