Dr Elizabeth Dick

Dr Elizabeth Dick is a Consultant Radiologist and Honorary Senior Lecturer at Imperial College NHS Trust with expertise in Body MRI, Emergency, Trauma and MSK Radiology, subjects upon which she regularly publishes and lectures nationally and internationally. She completed a Fellowship in Body MRI; earning her doctoral degree at Imperial College, as well as an MSK Fellowship at Duke University, North Carolina.

At Imperial College Healthcare Trust she is Head of Trauma Radiology as well as Divisional Director of Medical Education. She has published several books and set up and taught on numerous UK postgraduate courses to medical and paramedical specialists. She is Past President of the British Society of Emergency Radiology and President of the European Society of Emergency Radiology.



Dr Jeanette Dickson

Dr Jeanette Dickson graduated from Glasgow University and trained in medicine and oncology in Glasgow and Eastbourne. She undertook a MD in "predicting intrinsic radiosensitivity" at the Paterson Institute, Manchester. Jeanette also completed her training at Mount Vernon Cancer Centre, where she was appointed a consultant in 2002 and later served as Clinical Director for 5 years. Speaker Biographies



Professor Duncan Ettles

Professor Duncan Ettles is an Edinburgh graduate who has spent 25 years working as a Consultant Interventional Radiologist. During that time, he has been closely involved in the development and introduction of many of the minimally invasive treatments now used in the management of vascular disease.

He is a keen teacher and has held several national training roles as well as serving as an examiner for the Royal College of Radiologists for 12 years. He has acted as visiting professor to numerous institutions both in the UK and overseas. He was appointed as the first RCR/British Society of Interventional Radiology (BSIR) visiting professor in interventional radiology and in 2018 he was awarded the BSIR Gold Medal. He is former President of the British Society of Interventional Radiology, a member of RCR Faculty Board and is an expert adviser to The National Institute of Care and Excellence (NICE) and NIHR.



Dr Christopher Clarke

Dr Christopher Clarke is a consultant radiologist at Nottingham sub-specialising in gastrointestinal (GI) and hepatobiliary imaging with non-vascular intervention. He <u>completed a fellows</u>hip in GI imaging at Leeds Teaching Hospitals.

Christopher is the author of Chest X-rays for Medical Students, Abdominal X-rays for Medical Students, which was highly commended at the 2016 BMA Medical Book Awards, and FRCR Physics Notes books. He currently sits as a member of the online editorial board for the European Society of Gastrointestinal and Abdominal Radiology (ESGAR).

He is also a keen educator and the founder of Radiology Café, a website for radiology trainees and junior doctors interested in clinical radiology.



Dr Khalil ElGendy

Amy completed her medical training at the University of Cambridge. She joined the North West London Radiology training scheme and subsequently completed her subspecialty training in Radionuclide Radiology at Imperial College NHS Trust.

Dr Reshat Reshat

Mr Reshat Reshat has been working as a Senior Clinical Vascular Scientist for 8 yearsthe last 3 yeast at UCLH. Dr Reshat's clinical training began in Bristol via the NHS Modernising Scientist Careers Scientist Training Programme which included a variety of clinical rotations to make him a more rounded healthcare scientist. Upon graduating, he progressed to a senior role where he supervised and mentored junior scientists, planned, designed and carried out my own clinical research and of course fulfilled my clinical duties.

So what does a vascular scientist do? We use ultrasound to image arteries and veins throughout most of the body. This may be anything from imaging the circle of Willis in sickle cell children to using ultrasound guided compression to plug a ruptured radial artery pseudoaneurysm in a COVID patient on ITU.

Other scans include aortic aneurysms, peripheral vascular disease, bypass grafts, EVAR stents, AV fistulas, carotid arteries and temporal arteries for giant cell arteritis. With the development of new techniques like contrast enhanced studies, vascular ultrasound remains an exciting field.



Mr Paul Killoran

Mr Paul Killoran is a Reporting Radiographer at University College London Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust. Paul qualified in 1986 and reports chest and musculoskeletal films. He has also previously won the Society of Radiographers Radiologist of the Year award.



Ms Claire Skinner

Ms Claire Skinner is a consultant clinical scientist and head of the radiological physics and radiation safety group at the Royal Free London NHS Foundation Trust. She has worked as a medical physicist in the NHS for over 30 years. Claire was educated in physics and medical physics at University College and Queen Mary and Westfield College in London. She trained at the Royal London Hospital and specialised in diagnostic radiology physics. She is a registered clinical scientist, a chartered scientist and holds a Radiation Protection Adviser certificate of competence. She is also a corporate member of IPEM and SRP.
